



GOSPEL Mark 5:21-24, 35b-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him.

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

STRATEGIC PLANNING UPDATE

- 1. Over the past few months, we have been engaged in Strategic Planning for the future of both St. James and St. John Parishes. I realize this has been a challenging process for all of us as we look to where the Holy Spirit is calling us into the
- 2. I wish to state that no decisions have been made regarding the closing, moving, or changing current Mass times of either parish.
- 3. I wish to apologize for any pain this process has caused members of our community as we have labored in this question. Change is difficult - for all of us. Information that is not reflective of the process and the discussions that are happening has floated through the community creating tension and division. This pains me as your pastor, and I want nothing more than to bring unity to our community.
- 4. We have also surfaced that over the history of both parishes trust has been broken by pastors, by the Diocese, and between parishioners. I recognize that it is hard to look to the future and ask people to flex and change if trust isn't there.
- 5. I and the Team desire to understand where trust and credibility has broken down over the years so that I and the planning team can work to rebuild trust and credibility as we look to the future full of hope.
- 6. On August 11, 12 and 13 we will host a series of listening sessions for you to come and engage in conversation where your story can be heard. These are going to be honorable conversations that allow myself, the Team, and Fr. Kastl, the Vicar General, to hear your heart, your pain, your hopes and anxieties about the future. More information will come out regarding how to sign up and participate. We are reviewing other avenues of communication for those unavailable on these dates or who don't feel comfortable in an open setting as proposed.
- 7. Let me reiterate no decisions have been made to close St. James or St. John. Help me and help us know the deeper realities of our communities.


